Tips for online learners:

- For a background image, include "background" in your search.
- For a foreground image – like a character, include "transparent" in your search.
- If you have an image that you want to remove the background from you can do this at www.remove.bg.
- Use a dark-coloured shape for the background of your page and add a text box anywhere you want to add a part of the story.
