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Getting to School

Driving

Rangeview Intermediate has two entrances. The main entrance is Keru Place. The rear entrance is located at the end of Ozich Avenue. These areas are usually very busy at the end of the school day, so it would be helpful if you could organise a pickup place with your child at the start of the year. (some good places could be the Countdown Carpark , or a location on Strid Road etc.)

Parents are asked not to drive into the car park or wait on the yellow lines in turning area for health and safety reasons.

Catching the Bus

The school has a bus route - 022 which is used only by Rangeview students, a staff member ensures safe boarding onto the bus after school each day.

Biking

Please remember that all students bringing a bicycle or scooter to school must wear a helmet. Our bike racks are located behind room 3. Please ensure that they bring a bike lock and lock up their bike and helmet each day. The school takes no responsibility for bicycles or scooters on school property. Bikes are to be walked while within school grounds.

Uniform

As a school we like to see our tamariki taking pride in their uniform. Our school uniform supplier is NZ Uniforms. Their shop is located at 7 Rata Street, New Lynn. They can provide WINZ quotes and help you with all of your uniform needs. Further information is available on our website.

Shoes must be either black polishable lace-up shoes or black leather Roman sandals. Boots, sports shoes and suede shoes are not permitted.

Uniform passes

It is important to us that uniform does not hinder your child from coming to school. If your child comes to school in non-uniform items, they will need to come to the Deputy principals to get a uniform pass.

Cultural and Religious exemptions

If your child is required to wear a particular item of clothing for cultural or religious reasons, then Rangeview is happy to accommodate these needs. In these circumstances, a parent will need to send an email directly to the principal requesting special consideration.

Kickstart your year 2024

Powhiri

A whole school powhiri will be held at 10am to welcome all new students and staff to our Rangeview whānau.



Phones and Devices

Phones are to be handed in to the homeroom teacher at the start of each day, they will be locked away and can be collected at the end of the day.

Rangeview is a BYOD(Bring your own Device) school, you are welcome to bring your device to school each day, this will be handed to your homeroom teacher at the beginning of each day and will be given out for lessons where a device is needed for learning.

Your child will have received a stationery list on Super Seven's Day. Stationery packs can be picked up from Warehouse Stationery on Lincoln Road.
